Modest Results

"They (the ministering angels) said to him, 'Where is Sarah your wife?' And he said, 'Behold!-in the tent!' And he said, 'I will surely return to you at this time next year, and behold Sarah your wife will have a son." (Bereishis 18:9-10)

Rashi cites a *gemarah* in Bava Metzia (87a) which explains the rationale behind the angels' inquiry of Sarah's location. The *gemarah* tells us that in reality the angels were fully aware of Sarah's whereabouts. Why then did they prompt Avraham to tell them that which they already knew? Rav Yehudah, in the name of Rav, says that they did this in order to endear Sarah to her husband. The angels hoped that Avraham's response of Sarah being in the tent would enhance his sense of admiration for his wife. The fact that Sarah did not come out to dine with or wait on male guests, but modestly kept out of view, would help Avraham recognize how special his wife truly was.

Rav Chaim Shmulevitz (1902-1979, Rosh Yeshiva of the Mirrer Yeshiva), z"l, explains that although Avraham and Sarah were already married for many years and both exceedingly saintly, nevertheless there was still the need to constantly generate endearment between husband and wife. In order to help Avraham accomplish this, the angels asked him the whereabouts of his wife Sarah. Thus, we see the importance of working to keep the relationship between husband and wife that of continuous endearment and admiration for one another.

Additionally, the Ben Ish Chai (1832-1909, Rabbi Yosef Chaim), z"l, comments, the reason why Avraham would eventually merit having a son was largely due to Sarah's exceptional attribute of modesty. In order to notify Avraham of what motivated Hashem to bless them with a child at such an elderly age, the angels therefore inquired about Sarah's location. This would help Avraham understand what merited him to be blessed with having the son he had yearned and more importantly, help him rec-

ognize to what magnitude the trait of modesty holds in the eyes of Hashem.

First: Aid

"So Hashem said, Because the outcry of Sodom and Gomorrah has become great, and because their sin has been very grave, I will descend and see: If they act in accordance with its outcry which has come to Me- then destruction! And if not, I will know." (Bereishis 18:20)

It is written in the book of *Yechezkiel*, "Behold, this was the sin of (the people of) Sodom... they did not strengthen the hand of the poor and the needy." (*Yechezkiel 16:49*) We learn from here that the 'great outcry' stated in the *pasuk* by Hashem is actually referring to the lack of charitable acts carried out by the nations of Sodom and Gomorrah.

This, however, is difficult to comprehend. The story of the destruction of Sodom preempted the giving of the Torah by many centuries. How is it possible for an entire nation to be punished by death for transgressing a commandment that they were never even commanded to guard? The only laws that were required to be guarded at that time were the seven Noahide laws; charitable acts were not one of them?

Rabbi Elchonon Wasserman (1874 – 1941, a prominent Rabbi and Rosh Yeshiva in pre-World War II Europe) z"l, attempts to clarify the issue. When the pasuk in Yechezkiel attributes the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah on the lack of executing acts of kindness, it is not referring to what essentially caused their annihilation. Rather, it is identifying the preventative measures that could have been taken to stop the destruction from taking place altogether. Although the people of Sodom and Gomorrah were not instructed to be kind and generous, if they would have realized on their own the importance of being compassionate to others, Hashem, in return, would have overlooked their despicable transgressions and ultimately spared them of their demise.
