Building For The Future

"He (Yaakov) sent Yehudah before him to Yosef, to instruct ahead of him in Goshen; and they came to the land of Goshen" (Bereishis 46:28)

Rashi cites the *Medrash Rabbah* (95:3) that explains what prompted Yaakov to dispatch Yehudah ahead of the rest of the family. It was for the sole purpose of establishing a *yeshiva*, a house of study, to help initiate Torah study immediately upon their arrival in Egypt. Yaakov recognized the importance of having a place of Torah study and therefore arranged for Yehuda, his most capable and responsible son, to establish a *Beis Medrash* prior to thier arrival. It is apparent from Yaakov's action that when it comes to building a Torah community, the first, and perhaps the most important priority is to establish a place for Torah study. It is only then that a community can flourish and grow to its fullest potential.

The *Medrash* states yet another reason why Yehudah was sent ahead of the rest of his family. It was in order to prepare for them quarters; not for Torah study, but for the practical purpose of living. One can understand why it would be necessary to send Yehudah to set up a house for Torah study, but dwelling quarters? Couldn't Yaakov expect to find shelter for his family for a little while until they would complete the houses in Goshen? Additionally, wouldn't Yosef, the viceroy of Egypt be more capable than Yehudah with the task of preparing living quarters for his newly migrated family? Why did Yaakov need to entrust Yehudah with this task?

Rav Yosef Salant, *z"l*, in his *sefer*, Be'er Yosef, answers the following: Yaakov was concerned about the negative impact that dwelling in Egypt would have on his family. He therefore instructed Yehudah to confirm that the living quarters designated by Yosef was a safe distance away from the rest of the Egyptian population. The Zohar (*Shemos*) explains that Egypt was a spiritual wasteland full of sorcery, idol worship, and immorality. Yaa-

kov in no way wanted his beloved children to be lured into mingling with the impure Egyptians and risk his family's spiritual descent, as the *pasuk* in *Devarim* tells us, "For you know how we dwelled in the land of Egypt... and you saw their abominations and detestable idols of wood, and stone..." (29:15-16) With this in mind Yaakov sent Yehudah to go and scout out a suitable location far away from the tainted air of the Egyptian people.

We can now understand why Yaakov specifically designated Yehudah, and not Yosef, for the task of obtaining a suitable place for his family to reside. Yaakov knew that Yosef intended for the city of Goshen to be a safe haven for k'lal Yisroel to live. However, he feared that Yosef would not be sensitive to his concerns that his children may ultimately integrate with the Egyptian society. Additionally, Yaakov feared that Yosef may procrastinate in the actual planning and building of the city, and insist that they first move into the palace, under his watchful eye. Yaakov's fears seem quite sensible. Yosef had already been the viceroy of Egypt for many years; we can assume that he would be desensitized to the impurities surrounding him. Thus, Yaakov instructed Yehudah to scout out Goshen and determine its suitability. If the city possessed what Yaakov was looking for then Yehudah was to make sure that any necessary building be completed by the time of the family's arrival. Yaakov would not risk being forced to settle in the palace, even temporarily.

Just as our forefather Yaakov recognized upon entering *galus*, exile, the tremendous risks involved when living in close proximity to people of indecent values, so must we do the same. One must never ignore the impact that one's surroundings can have, both on themselves and on their family. As the *gemarah* in Sukkah (56a) teaches, "Fortunate are the righteous, and fortunate are their neighbors; woe to the wicked, and woe to their neighbors."

"And now, be not distressed, nor reproach yourselves for having sold me here... thus Hashem sent me here... It was not you... but Hashem" (45:4-7)

It is obvious from the *pasukim* that Yosef wanted to somehow console his brothers; that their terrible sin of selling him into slavery was all part of Hashem's master plan.

How would this make the brothers feel reassured that that they were not to be blamed for their serious transgression? They still had freedom of choice to decide whether or not to sin?
